Scottish Government commitment to citizen participation

The Programme For Government 2015-16, states:

*“The Christie Commission told us that public services must be designed with and for people and communities.Our approach to reform has, at its core, a desire to engage citizens and **seek their participation in the design and delivery of public services.**”*

Why co-design GP digital services

- We want to:
 - embed a person-centred approach to eHealth driven by people's needs, seeing tech as an enabler of improved care
 - work with citizens as partners so they can provide their ideas and help shape evolution of GP digital services
 - improve the design and take-up of person-facing eHealth services so benefits are derived

Scope

- **Scope is:**
 - GP practice services
 - Digital (internet enabled) services within this service context
- **Out of scope are:**
 - Existing transactional options (GP online appointment booking, repeat prescription ordering), the proposed online access to a summary of your medical record and the 'patient portal'

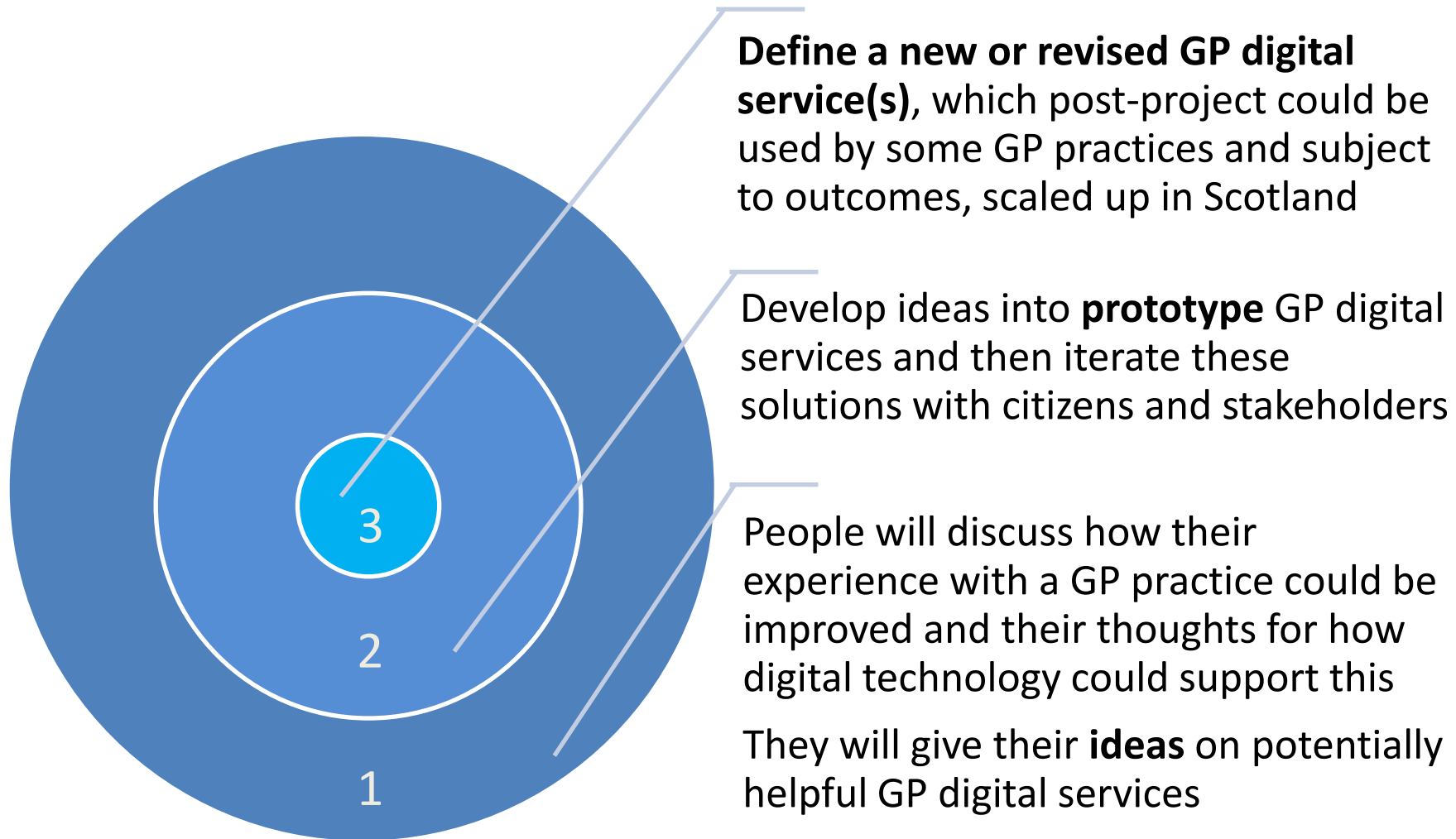
Project vision

- Funded via innovation element of the SG GP digital services fund
- Project vision is to:

co-design an innovative digital GP service or services, that could have the potential to transform and enable better care, by collaborating with people and professionals across Scotland

- Starting point is to better understand how citizens are interacting with GP practices and their needs within this context
- We will explore how digital could meet some of these needs in order to transform and improve their healthcare experience

Three step approach to project co-design



SG/ALLIANCE early inputs to the project

- **Strategic context:** direction of travel for GP practices and primary care in Scotland, information on existing GP digital services and other initiatives e.g. patient portal, WebGP...
- **Patient data:** on which groups more likely to visit GP practices etc
- **Citizen representatives:** working with partner networks to promote participation in the project, including a representative mix of over 100 people to attend the co-design workshops
- **Stakeholder contacts:** facilitating access to relevant professionals e.g. GP practice staff

mHabitat Phases/Reports

- **Phase 1 (to October)** includes: desk research, interviews, staff survey, ethnographic research at several GP practices
- **Phase 2 (to January)** includes: 7 co-design workshops across Scotland with mix of citizens and professionals (5:1 mix) progressing to idea generation, wireframes and eventual prototyping which will be taken on a roadshow tour combined with website/social media use to get feedback
- **Phase 3 (to April)** includes: will phase 1 and 2 outputs into detailed report with recommendations
